Rick Wheeler does not romanticize his subjects. A collection of wild creatures looks on from his studio wall, and their collective effect commands attention before one even gets close enough to see the intricacies that make up each piece. Eyes and fur and feathers beautifully rendered so that one feels privy to the soul of these wild creatures. It is a testament to his skill that the viewer may wonder if Wheeler's subjects are actually the ones doing the observing.

Rick Wheeler has been working in scratchboard for about 25 years and began teaching his methods 17 years ago. A naturalist, who works from his own photographs, Wheeler captures the character and behavior of his subjects impeccably well. He uses watercolor and some oil glazing to great effect. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



We have passed an important milestone in the Pass the Beret campaign for 2016. As of July 5th, we crossed the \$15,000 threshold. The Gallery Two Exhibit for Aloha High School artists opened on July 2nd for a 6 day show. This inspiring show was titled "No More Blank Space". A hundred works were on display. It was a pleasure to see these talented artists enjoying this opportunity to exhibit at OSA. They prepared and hung the show themselves with the guidance of their instructor, Tamara Ottum, and Gallery Director, Linda Church. Six students gave wonderful readings of their poems or short stories at the reception. These artists were well supported by their classmates, families, friends, and teachers. About 80 people attended the reception. Not a single person I spoke with had ever heard of OSA or attended an event at OSA prior to this show. Our Gallery Two Exhibits are bringing the OSA and the community at large closer together.

The next OSA exhibit, Extreme Sizes, opens on July 10th, and will be on display by the time you see this message. For many of us, size is an important consideration in the creation of our art. In this show, chaired by Kris Kuester, we get a chance to see artistic expression mostly unfettered by the constraints of size considerations, from the monumental to the miniature.

JANE AUKSHUNAS: EXPLORING WITH OIL PASTELS-COLOR, SHAPE, AND TEXTURE

Saturday and Sunday, August 13 and 14, 9am - 4pm, \$195

Oil pastel is a vibrant and versatile medium that can be used both for drawing and painting techniques. In this 2-day workshop, students will learn ways to use the medium and explore how oil pastel can be manipulated and adapted to one's own means of expression. As using oil pastel is such a direct process with no brush or color mixing involved, it's easy to be spontaneous and have fun using it.

This workshop is suitable both for beginners and those more experienced. Abstract or realistic approaches both work. We'll work to each student's ability, have fun, grow our skills and confidence, and encourage each other by sharing the experience. The goal is to become better acquainted with the medium and become comfortable in using it as a tool in developing one's own personal artistic vision. ERIK SANDGREN: COLOR, LIGHT AND SPACE – WORKING WITH ACRYLICS AND AQUEOUS MEDIA

Saturday and Sunday, September 24 and 25, 9am - 4pm both days, \$250

Washington artist, printmaker and educator Erik Sandgren believes that acrylics and other aqueous media offer tremendous advantages and versatility for an evolving painting process. In this workshop, Erik will show you his techniques for manipulating the paint film in unorthodox ways such as glazing, scratching, scuffing, and abrading. He has many strategies to share about materials and techniques, driven by each student's desire for expression based on color and composition. There will be daily demonstrations, with group and individual conversations, all interspersed with looking at some master paintings. Bring your favorite water-based materials and tools, along with your sketchbooks and suitable supports (panels, paper or canvas). He suggests also bringing one failed, stalled or abandoned painting in acrylic or another aqueous medium- the objective is for everyone in the workshop to take away something useful that will inspire a fresh take on his or her work. Everything You Treasure, for a World Free from Nuclear Weapons

Featuring Artwork by Yukiyo Kawano

Meet the artist and representatives from Physicians for Social Responsibility and Soka Gakki International

Closing Reception Friday August 5, 7 - 10PM

Please join OSA members and the community for this exhibition jointly created by Soka Gakki International and the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN). The exhibit was launched in Hiroshima in August 2012 at the 20th World Congress of the International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War (IPPNW). The exhibit has a total of 40 panels divided into 3 sections: What do we treasure?, Learning More, and Changing our Worldview.

The OSA Gallery art exhibit features the art of Yukiyo Kawano, a third generation hibakusha (nuclear bomb survivor). Her work is personal, reflecting past and present attitudes towards the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. Kawano's main focus is her/our forgetfulness, her/our dialectic of memory, and issues around culture, politics and history. Kawano currently lives in Portland, Oregon.

During the closing reception on August 5th, the OSA gallery space will be filled with paper lanterns. These are floating lanterns from the annual August 6th Lantern Ceremony on Green Lake, Washington which memorializes the day the first a-bomb was dropped on human beings and the subsequent bombing of Nagasaki on August 9th. There will be a booth demonstrating Japanese calligraphy as well as a short Butoh dance performance.
